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**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY
OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF BLOOMINGDALE BY
AN “ON-LINE” AUCTION SERVICE**

WHEREAS, the Village of Bloomingdale, DuPage County, Illinois (the “Village”) is a home rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, except as limited by such Section 6, a home rule unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including but not limited to the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; to license, to tax; and to incur debt; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Bloomingdale Village Code; Title 3 (Finance & Taxation); Chapter 2 (PURCHASING, PROCUREMENT AND DISPOSAL PROCEDURES); Section 7. (Competitive Bidding, Advertising, And Disposal Procedures And Requirements); Subsection E. (Disposal of Personal Property Under \$20,000) in the opinion of at least a simple majority of the corporate authorities of the Village, it is no longer necessary or useful to, or in the best interests of the Village to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Village President and Board of Trustees to sell said surplus personal property by means of an “on-line” auction, conducted by an “on-line” auction service, or by other means as determined by the Village Administrator, or his designee, to obtain the maximum value for said personal property; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance represents an exercise of the home rule powers conferred upon the Village of Bloomingdale by the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED By The President and Board of Trustees of The Village of Bloomingdale, Du Page County, Illinois, Pursuant To Its Home Rule Powers, As Follows:

SECTION ONE: The Village President and Board of Trustees find that the following described surplus personal property now owned by the Village is no longer necessary or useful, and it is in the best interest of the Village that it be disposed by means of an “on-line” auction, conducted by an “on-line” auction service:

SECTION TWO: The Village Administrator, or his designee, is hereby authorized and directed to sell the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village to the highest bidder on said property by means of an “on-line” auction, or by other means as determined by the Village Administrator, or his designee, to obtain the maximum value for the aforementioned surplus personal property.

SECTION THREE: The Village Administrator, or his designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a consignment agreement, or other appropriate instrument for the sale of said surplus personal property with an “on-line” auction service, to obtain the maximum value for the aforementioned personal property.

SECTION FOUR: Upon payment of the full agreed price, the Village Administrator, or his designee, is hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all necessary documentation to convey and transfer title of the aforesaid surplus personal property to the successful bidder, or purchaser to obtain the maximum value for the aforementioned surplus personal property.

SECTION FIVE: Other Actions Authorized: The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all actions necessary or reasonably required to carry out and give effect to the intent of this Ordinance and otherwise to consummate the transactions contemplated herein, and shall take all actions necessary in conformity therewith including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of all documents required to be delivered in connection with the transaction contemplated herein.

SECTION SIX: Acts of Village Officials: That all past, present and future acts and doings of the officials of the Village that are in conformity with the purpose and intent of this Ordinance are hereby, in all respects, ratified, approved, authorized and confirmed.

SECTION SEVEN: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, by a simple majority vote of the corporate authorities, and approval in the manner provided by law.
