**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BLOOMINGDALE VILLAGE CODE,
AS AMENDED, TITLE 4 (BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS);
CHAPTER 2 (ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES); SECTION 10 (NUMBER OF LICENSES)
TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF CLASS "D-2" LIQUOR LICENSES,
DESVIN INC. (D.B.A. STRADA ITALIA)**

WHEREAS, the Village of Bloomingdale, DuPage County, Illinois (the "Village") is a home rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and, except as limited by such Section, it may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Desvin Inc. has submitted an application for a Class D-2 Dining (Full Liquor) Village liquor license, to sell alcoholic beverages at their new Strada Italia Restaurant, located at 152 Stratford Square, Space B-1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BLOOMINGDALE, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Title 4 (Business And License Regulations); Chapter 2 (Alcoholic Beverages); Section 10 (Number of Licenses) of the Bloomingdale Village Code is hereby amended, as set forth on the attached Exhibit A, to increase the number of Class D-2 liquor licenses by one (1), resulting in a final count of twenty one (21) total Class D-2 liquor licenses after the adjustment for expired liquor licenses. Per Village Ordinance 2018-27, "If any such license described herein is revoked, surrendered, or abandoned that class of license shall automatically be reduced by one." A summary of the expired licenses since the passage of Ordinance 2018-27 are summarized in the table below.
