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**RESOLUTION NO. 2022-R-24**

**A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF AN APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF ILLINOIS FOR ILLINOIS TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (ITEP) FUNDING FOR THE FREEPORT DRIVE ADA SIDEWALK ACCESS TO DUJARDIN SCHOOL PROJECT**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Bloomingdale, DuPage County, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") is a home rule unit of local government, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, except as limited by Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Bloomingdale owns, operates and maintains an accessway linking Freeport Drive to DuJardin School which is not an accessible route; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Bloomingdale desires to participate in the construction of a barrier free ADA accessible sidewalk linking the Westlake Highlands Subdivision to DuJardin Elementary School; and

**WHEREAS**, an Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) Grant will fund 80% of the preliminary engineering, design, and construction for the project with 20% to be paid for with local funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Bloomingdale does hereby commit funds in the amount of \$61,480 as described in Section 2 herein to cover its share of the preliminary engineering, design and construction expenses; and

**WHEREAS**, many students and families desire to utilize the accessway to DuJardin School from Freeport Drive as a safe and convenient route to the school for pedestrians; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Complete Streets policy encourages walking and biking and other non-motorized transit; and

**WHEREAS**, the route between Freeport Drive and DuJardin School has obstructions which are not ADA compliant nor can be easily used by bicyclists or by people with younger children in strollers; and

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**WHEREAS**, the route between Freeport Drive and DuJardin School has obstructions which are not ADA compliant nor can be easily used by bicyclists or by people with younger children in strollers; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Accessibility of Public Right-of-Way Transition Plan desires to provide accessible pedestrian design features as part of capital improvement projects so that access is ADA compliant; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Bloomingdale supports Safe Routes to School transportation systems, which the proposed sidewalk access would be a part of for DuJardin School;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bloomingdale, DuPage County, Illinois pursuant to the Village of Bloomingdale's "Home Rule Powers" as follows:

**Section One - Recitals**

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preamble to this resolution are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this resolution as legislative findings.

**Section Two – Committing Local Funds**

The Village of Bloomingdale estimates the cost of the project at \$307,400 and does hereby commit funds from Motor Fuel Tax Fund for use in conjunction with Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) funds totaling \$61,480, such local funds to equal 20% of the estimated total project cost of \$307,400, with the remaining 80% project cost of \$245,920 to utilize ITEP funding.

**Section Three -- Other Actions Authorized**

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all actions necessary or reasonably required to carry out and give effect to the intent of this resolution and otherwise to consummate the transactions contemplated herein, and shall take all actions necessary in conformity therewith including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of all documents required to be delivered in connection with the transaction contemplated herein.

**Section Four - Acts of Village Officials**

That all past, present and future acts and doings of the officials of the Village that are in conformity with the purpose and intent of this Resolution are hereby, in all respects, ratified, approved, authorized and confirmed.

**Section Five – Effective Date**

This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

**Section Six - Publication**

This resolution shall be published in book or pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code.

**Section Seven – Conflict Clause**

All resolutions, parts or resolutions or board actions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section Eight – Saving Clause**

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this resolution is declared by a court of law to be invalid or unconstitutional, the invalidity or unconstitutionality thereof shall not affect the validity of any other provisions of this resolution, which are hereby declared to be separable.

**Section Nine - Passage Clause**

That this resolution shall take full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

**Section Ten - Recording**

This resolution shall be entered into the minutes and upon the journals of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Bloomingdale.
